USING THE ONLINE CATALOG (<http://read.cnu.edu>)

Using the Smith Library's online catalog you will be able to find books and audiovisual materials on the topic of multiculturalism. Check the *Library of Congress Subject Headings* on microfiche located at the Reference Desk to determine which subject headings will be most useful to your research. Suggested subject headings include the following:

INDEXES AND ABSTRACTS

ERIC (Education Resources Information Center)

Provides indexing and abstracts to over 750 professional education journals. Most documents (indicated by ED in the accession number) are available on microfiche in the Microforms Area up to Dec. 2002. After 2002, most documents are provided full-text through the database. Check the Periodicals Listings for availability of journal articles (EJ in the accession number.)

ERIC is available online via Ebsco (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/ericeb.html>), FirstSearch (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/ericfs.html>), and Cambridge Scientific Abstracts (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/ericcsa.html>).

ERIC is also available for free on the Department of Education's website. (<http://www.eric.ed.gov/>).

ProQuest Online (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/proq.html>)

The ProQuest online information service provides access to thousands of current periodicals and newspapers, many updated daily. Indexing coverage for the online version: ABI/Inform 1918-present; Research Library Complete 1971-present; Social Sciences 1988-present. Full-text availability varies by title.

JSTOR (<http://0-www.jstor.org.read.cnu.edu/jstor/>)

An online database of full-content articles from various journals in many subject areas including Education. Please note that due to restrictions, current years of the journals are not available in JSTOR.

FirstSearch (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/firstsearch.html>)

FirstSearch is a group of databases available online. Choose the *Education* topic area.

Infotrac Expanded Academic (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/expaca.html>)

From arts and the humanities to social sciences, science and technology, this database meets research needs across all academic disciplines. Access scholarly journals, magazines and newspapers - with some full text and images.

ENCYCLOPEDIAS AND DICTIONARIES

Dictionary of Multicultural Education (Ref LC1099 D53 1997)

Multicultural terms, theories and areas of study are explained with many references. Biographical information is not included. Appendix gives a list of Internet resources and relevant national organizations

Gale Encyclopedia of Multicultural America (Ref E184 A1 G14 2000)

Covers 152 ethnic, ethnoreligious, and Native American cultures currently residing in the U.S. Essays are arranged alphabetically by the most commonly cited name for the group. Includes a general subject index. Also Online: <http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/encymultaffairs.html>

Harvard Encyclopedia of American Ethnic Groups (Ref E184 A1 H339)

Although somewhat dated, this volume is the standard reference work and assembles basic information about the "multitude of peoples" who make up the United States. Succinct and authoritative articles about the origins, history, and present situation of many ethnic groups. Many articles include references.

HANDBOOKS AND GUIDES (LOCATED IN THE GENERAL COLLECTION)

Counseling for Diversity: a Guide for School Counselors and Related Professionals (LB1027.5 C653 1995)

Focuses on developmental counseling in a culturally pluralistic school environment. Provides intervention strategies and techniques for counseling, consultation, classroom guidance, and coordination for promoting the development of racially/ethnically diverse student groups.

Culturally Responsive Teaching: Theory, Research & Practice (LC1099.3 G393 2000)

Intended to aid in the development of the knowledge, convictions and skills required to improve the achievement of students of color who are not performing well. Part of the *Multicultural Education Series*. Check the online catalog (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/printmes.html>) for other titles included in this series.

Multicultural Gifted Education (LC3993.9 F658 1999)

Created to address what is required to make gifted education multicultural. Part of the *Education and Psychology of the Gifted Series*. Check the online catalog (<http://purl.oclc.org/CNU/printmedgift.html>) for other titles included in this series.

Multicultural Teaching: A Handbook of Activities, Information, and Resources (LC1099.3 T54 1999)

Features two major components for multicultural teaching: (1) a knowledge base for teaching multiculturally and (2) activities that provide learning opportunities. Aims to establish a strong foundation for an integrated multicultural curriculum that teachers in grades k-8 can implement in the classroom.

Taking Sides: Clashing Views on Controversial Educational Issues (LB41 T275 1999)

Presents opposing viewpoints on educational issues of concern. Includes issues such as: *Are School Integration Efforts Doomed to Failure?*; *Do Black Students Need an Afrocentric Curriculum?*; or *Should Multiculturalism Permeate the Curriculum?*.

Teaching With a Multicultural Perspective: a Practical Guide (LC1099.3 D39 1997)

Provides a practical model for multicultural education, a set of multicultural planning questions, and curriculum case studies.
